

Halliburton Company Donates \$30,000 To Venezuelan Relief Fund

Employees in both areas are also collecting food, medical supplies and clothing to send for relief efforts.

In addition, Halliburton Company is providing trucks and fork lifts to move donated supplies from the Venezuelan Consulate General's offices to the airport and Port of Houston, so that the much needed relief materials make it Venezuela in a timely manner.
